The DEC is within Nottingham Trent University's city campus.


We're adjacent to the Dryden Centre and opposite the Bonington Gallery.

Getting to the DEC by bus or tram

Public Transport

The nearest tram stop is Nottingham Trent University and is around a 3-minute walk to the Dryden Enterprise Centre.

Trams run regularly to Nottingham Train Station. The train station is around 15 – 20 minutes' walk away.

The nearest bus stops are located on South Sherwood Street and are around a 3-minute walk to the Dryden Enterprise Centre. You can find more information on local bus services at CT4N, Nottingham City Transport and Trent Barton.

Stops are named NTU City Campus G1, G2 and G3.

Car Parking

Paid on street parking is available on nearby Dryden Street, Gill Street, Hampden Street and Peel Street. You can pay using the meter or the RingGo app.

On street parking is free to blue badge holders.

The nearest multi-story car parks can be found at <u>Trinity Square</u> or <u>Talbot Street</u>. Typically, car parking is around £14 for 8 hours.

Visitors to the Dryden Enterprise Centre who park at Trinity Square can access discounted parking at £6.50 per day. At the Trinity Square payment machine, quote code 177 to the car parking operator through the intercom. The operator will then issue a new ticket with the validated price.
